My Beautiful Blue Car

It proved that she was really going places--didn't it?

We had struck out last deal. I thought it was a pretty good one. I would seek treatment for my alcoholism once again, if my husband would promise not to leave me.

This time it was his turn to break the deal, just as I had done so many times in the past. I came home from the doctor's office to find the house locked, and my husband, my three boys, and all their belongings gone. He even had enough nerve to drive away in my new blue car, leaving me with the old car, which he had disabled before he left. Now I was really mad! After all, hadn't I been the household's breadwinner, employed as a salesperson who needed reliable transportation to get to my work calls? Didn't I run all of the household errands, including the shopping and getting the kids to where they needed to be? I didn't think it mattered that I

kept a bottle of vodka under the front seat in case the morning jitters needed calming before an appointment. I deserved that drink for the drive home, since I worked so hard. I would use any excuse to get out of the house to keep my alcohol supply well-stocked and frequently drank while driving my boys all over town. I could see only my own anger and resentment toward my husband, who had not kept his word.

My drinking had caused a long history of bad credit issues. I could always rationalize bouncing a check and paying the overdraft fee of twenty-five dollars over having to wait until the next payday to buy a bottle of booze. When I received a little inheritance, I found one of my favorite cars, almost new, in the classified and paid cash for it. After a string of broken-down vehicles, my new car was a sign to me that my life was getting better. Only, my life was not getting better. No matter how many material or external things I gained, my life while drinking

continued to spiral downward. I filed for divorce and discovered that the car I so badly wanted returned to me would be staying in the possession of my soon-to-be-ex-husband. I really believed at the time that others were to blame for my continued drinking.

I had to make a decision. I decided that I must stay sober in order to see my children and, hopefully, get my car back. I reluctantly went back to AA meetings, where I ended up with a new home group and sponsor. I wasn't sure that my chance at sobriety would be different this time around, because I had such a history of relapsing. But this time around things were different. I had no place to turn for friendly direction in my life, so I wholeheartedly turned to the AA fellowship. I stopped trying to run the show and for the first time went to any lengths for sobriety. By working the Twelve Steps of the AA program and working on changing me, my life began to change.

Tonight, almost seven years after getting sober, I spotted my lovely blue car as I was dropping

off my boys at their dad's house. It had four flat tires and rust growing along the fenders. Leaves and bird droppings covered the top. Symbolically, I felt it had slowly died away and quit working, just like my old life of drinking.

My children hugged and kissed me and said that they love me. We look forward to the next time we'll be together. I got a friendly wave from my ex-husband out his kitchen window. I realized that the things that seemed so important to me while I was drinking are so unimportant to me today. I'd always thought that external things would make me whole and happy. Today I know that by staying sober and doing the next right thing, I can feel happy, joyous, and free. I have a full life with the love and respect of my family and friends. I also have the reminder that material rewards don't last, but friendships and love through recovery can be around for a lifetime.

History of Intergroup Offices

The Jack Alexander article in the *Saturday Evening Post* not only began a large influx of prospective members into AA, it began a new phenomenon. This new concept in AA was the beginning of Central Offices and Intergroups.

In the beginning there was the Central Committee in Cleveland, Ohio, where by October 1939 - hardly more than four years after Bill and Dr. Bob first met—a committee of seven was meeting once per month. The Central Committee in Akron was formed in the 1940's and Dr. Bob was not only a supporter but an active participant, according to fellow Akron member Dan K. "Doc used to play an important

part in the Central Committee," Dan observed, and the going could get rough: "During the meeting, sometimes, the words would fly like you were in a barroom."

Another early intergroup sprang up in Chicago, where an AA named Sylvia used her \$700 monthly alimony checks to rent an apartment in the suburb of Evanston, where the first AA meeting in the area was held in 1939. This was AA's first organized local service center" . . . followed by New York City in 1942, which was then operating out of a clubhouse on Manhattan's West 24th Street

A Columbus, Ohio, intergroup started up in 1943, followed by the Los Angeles Central Office a year later. "In those days AA wasn't easy to find - and we kept it that way," one old timer, sober since 1940, remembers. "A carefully

selected group of priests, judges and policemen knew about AA; our phone number wasn't listed and could be gotten only from information. That way we knew that any newcomer who found us had generally made enough of an effort to guarantee the sincerity of his desire for sobriety." In 1946 the Twelve Traditions were published, and the Third Tradition -- "The only requirement for AA membership is a desire to stop drinking" raised the level of tolerance by rendering subjective judgment superfluous when it came to who was sincere and who wasn't.

Many service offices, such as those in Chicago and Los Angeles, have grown out of a phone number, listed as belonging to AA, that was in a member's home. Some -- in New York City, Newark, New Jersey, and Edmonton, to name a few -- were out-growths of AA clubhouses that had been set up as hubs for AA activity and social events. Sometimes the clubs served as distribution points for AA literature, then began providing other services as well. Over time the service operations became entities separate from the clubhouses. In a surprising number of other localities -- notably in the Upper Midwest and in Canada -- intergroups or central service committees were in existence (some still are) long before there were actual offices. In Charleston, West Virginia, the term "intergroup" was first used in 1953. The association evolved directly from the first treatment center in the state, which was founded in 1944. It was called the Aican Center, Inc., but was fondly referred to by locals as "the jitter joint."

Before the first General Service Conference was held, in April 1951, at least 16 central offices/intergroups were serving local groups. Since they predated the formation of the General Service structure and performed a different function, they were not a part of the structure (except in Chicago, where the Area Service Office and Area Committee are essentially one). Sometimes over the years there was some overlapping of services, especially when both entities were performing similar services, in Public Information for instance, but eventually, thanks to shared experience and better communication, inter-groups and General Service have pretty much come to work hand-in-glove.

No one appreciated more than Bill W. the value of intergroups. Back in 1946 he exclaimed in the June Grapevine, "Heaven has surely reserved a special place for every one of them." Today there are approximately 1500 intergroup/central offices in the U.S. and Canada, including local answering services.
